SUMMER VICARAGE

Congregations around Lutheran Church-Canada are eligible to apply to the seminary for a student summer worker. Although it resembles the expectations of the Field Education, we call the program “Summer Vicarage.” Students will have both their Worship License and Preaching License, allowing them to conduct worship (though not communion) and preach with close supervision of a pastor. The congregation is expected to provide housing and a fair salary for summer work (a good rule of thumb is for 1/4 of the Synod salary scale for Vicars). We have one summer vicar assigned for 2016, working at All Saints Lutheran in Edmonton, and one request to Bethany, Campbell River was left unfilled. Pastor’s Sabbatical Week

CLS forms new pastors as servants for Jesus’ sake, as well as providing ongoing education opportunities for the laity (*Quest*). We also involve pastors in *Quest*, *Pastor’s Sabbatical Week*, open Convocations, co-publishing the *Lutheran Theological Review*. This June 6-10 we invite pastors for a “Pastoral Tune Up” time of intellectual stimulation and fellowship featuring Rev. Dr. Reed Lessing (parish pastor, former faculty member, author of the Jonah, Job, and Isaiah commentaries by CPH), Dr. Colleen Hammermaster (Counseling Psychologist

who provides wellness and healing foci for many pastors and Christians in LCC), Rev. Dr. Robert Bugbee (LCC President, speaking on preaching for today and giving a peek into what may be the future structure of LCC), and Revs. Darren Dressler and Michael Keith, who have had specialized training in ministry to those going through the grieving process.

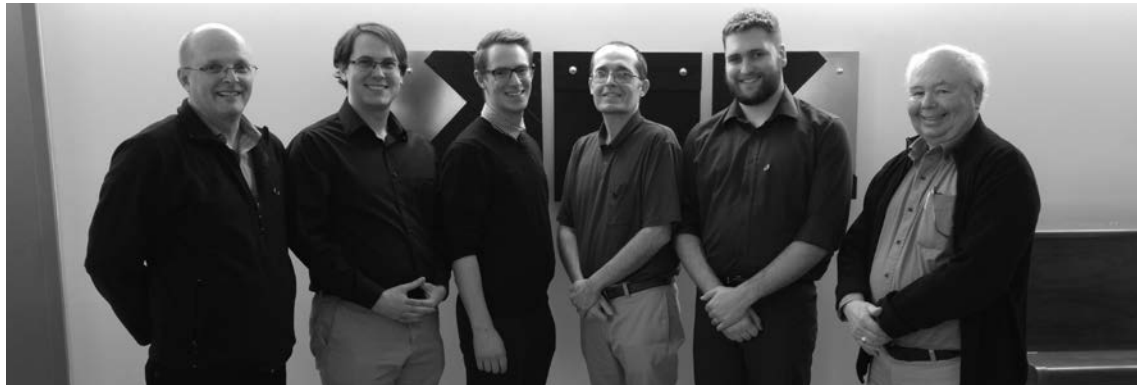

LOOKING BACK, LOOKING AHEAD!

Each year there is a great deal of excitement for the students as we approach the date for the Sacred Convocation. For many of the students it is a pivot point, where they look back on and celebrate the accomplishments that led them to this point, and they look ahead to what God has in store for them. Students completing their second year of studies look forward to vicarage, and graduates look forward to receiving their first call to ministry.

This is also a good time for those in the Adopt-A-Student program to look back and look ahead. As we look back over this past year, there is much for which to give God thanks. Sponsoring groups and individuals supported students with prayer, letters of encouragement, care packages, and donations. This year there were slightly fewer sponsors, from 48 to 44, but support has remained strong. Ladies groups and LWML societies together were the largest category of sponsor, 24, while 16 congregations and 4 individuals also sponsored students. The sponsors were spread throughout the prairies and west coast: BC – 16; AB – 15; SK – 10; MB – 2 and ON – 1.

Looking even further back we can see there is a steady faithfulness on the part of many Adopt-A-Student sponsors. Of all the sponsors participating this year, 30 of them have been sponsoring

students for 4 or more years; 24 of those have participated every single year going back to 2010 and probably beyond. What wonderful responses to the faithfulness of God!

Now as we pivot from looking back to looking ahead, there will be a **large number of students entering the seminary in the fall**. We will have an **even greater need for Adopt-A-Student sponsors** than ever. As you approach the summer break, this is still an ideal time to think about adopting new students, whether you have done this every year, or whether you are just now considering it for the first time! The November 2014 fire recovery is 99% complete. Our insurance covered over \$300,000 of the cleanup and recovery costs. This includes a repayment of roughly \$52,000 toward our out-of-pocket expenses at the time. Additional costs that we incurred have been offset by nearly \$24,000 in fire recovery support in Spring, 2015.

We hope that the remainder of the costs will be offset by healthy giving this Spring. *Thank you, our generous partners!*

Honorary Award Recipient

FAITH IN LIFE – Mrs. Perpetua Alfazema

We are pleased to announce that the recipient of the Faith in Life award at the 2016 Sacred Convocation is Perpetua Alfazema.

Perpetua Alfazema was born in Mozambique but had to flee during the civil war to find refuge in Canada. In 1995, she and her husband returned to his home land Kapasseni, only to find the village in ruins. Also, when her husband Pastor Joseph Alfazema was ordained in 2006, they answered God's call to return to Mozambique to start six Lutheran churches and many social ministries. They were determined to help and started the Kapasseni project to revive the area. Perpetua studied to become a nurse and a social worker and started the Kuwangisana non-profit organization to help people living with HIV/AIDS, chronic diseases, work with orphans and vulnerable children, and to address poverty.

Perpetua is gifted with exceptional organizational and leadership skills, a social work background, nurse's aide training, community support training, and business administration training.

She is a very dedicated missionary, and the Executive Director of Kuwangisana Organization.

"When I received Dr. Gimbel's email and read that I have been chosen as the recipient of the "Faith in Life" award... I was shocked. I could not believe it! Then I started crying with joy and felt so encouraged. Indeed, this is good news not only for me, but for my family in Edmonton, our supporters, and the team here at Kuwangisana and various communities we serve. Even though they will not be there physically to witness me receive the award, I am sure they will be there spiritually and in prayers. Dr. Gimbel's message came in at a time when I, personally, had been feeling helpless, hopeless and desperate as we are facing many challenges here in Mozambique. We are experiencing food shortages and a drought. People are dying of hunger."

Thus, Concordia Lutheran Seminary is pleased to award Perpetua Alfazema with the Faith in Life award.
